

Instructions to authors

One original and two high-quality copies of each manuscript, preferably in English (or Japanese), should be sent to the editor-in-chief. Manuscripts should be typewritten on one side of the paper only, double-spaced throughout, and with a wide margin (more than 2 cm). Original photographs should be provided with each copy. When a paper is submitted to **TROPICS**, it is assumed that the work has not been published elsewhere and that the paper is not being submitted simultaneously to another journal. **TROPICS** accepts full papers (scientific papers), short papers (scientific papers with fewer than 4 pages when printed), field notes, selected papers from symposiums (a fee is applicable), reviews, and monographs.

Following acceptance, a copy of the manuscript must be submitted on disk. We accept files from Windows or Macintosh. Major software is acceptable, and the author should specify the type of computer system, the word processor used, and the name of the software package. Submission is preferred on CD, but 3.5-inch floppy disks and MO disks are also acceptable.

Manuscripts may be submitted to **TROPICS** by E-mail with attached files. Text, tables and figures must be in Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel and EPS format, please do not include any tables or figures inside the text. We also accept PDF format for text, tables and figures. We are able to accept up to 3 MB file.

A contribution will be critically reviewed by two reviewers regarding the suitability of the manuscript for publication in **TROPICS**. The Editorial Committee reserves the right to make the final decision on the acceptance or rejection of the manuscript.

A cover page is required which includes a title, a running title, a list of authors names, institutes, and addresses, and the name of the corresponding author including telephone number, facsimile number, and e-mail address.

Abstract: Each paper should be provided with an abstract in English.

Key words: Several key words are required.

Citation of literature: In the text as follows: (Primack, 1991) or Ashton (1991). In the references as follows:

Primack, R. B. & Hall P. 1991. Species diversity research in Bornean forests with implications for conservation biology and silviculture.

Tropics 1: 91-111.

Jacobs, M. 1974. Botanical panorama of the Malesian archipelago. In UNESCO, Natural Resources of Humid Tropical Asia, 263-294. Paris.

Illustrations: Illustrations should be professionally drawn and lettered, or laser printed on smooth white paper. Photographs and color slides are also acceptable, but the author(s) will be charged for printing them in color.

Reprints: Fifty reprints will be supplied by actual expense. The author will be charged for additional reprint orders, at 5,000 yen (JPY) per 50 reprints.

Submission: Manuscripts and correspondence concerning editorial matters should be addressed to the Editorial Office.
